## William Otto Petersen, Club Member #2

Bill Petersen was introduced to sailing at an early age and began his racing career in the 1930s, crewing for his brothers Edward and Conrad. Bill became a member of the Lake Geneva Yacht Club in 1941 and competed until the early 1980s, as a helmsman in Es, and M20s. He served as Club Associate Chief Judge in 1960 and 1961, and as a Trustee from 1961 to 1971.

In the recent past, Bill was often seen enjoying Sunday lunch on the patio as the fleet returned from the morning race.

In 2005 Bill created the Black Point Historic Preserve and donated it to the State of Wisconsin. That same year he received the Conservation Stewardship Award from the Geneva Lake Conservancy.
